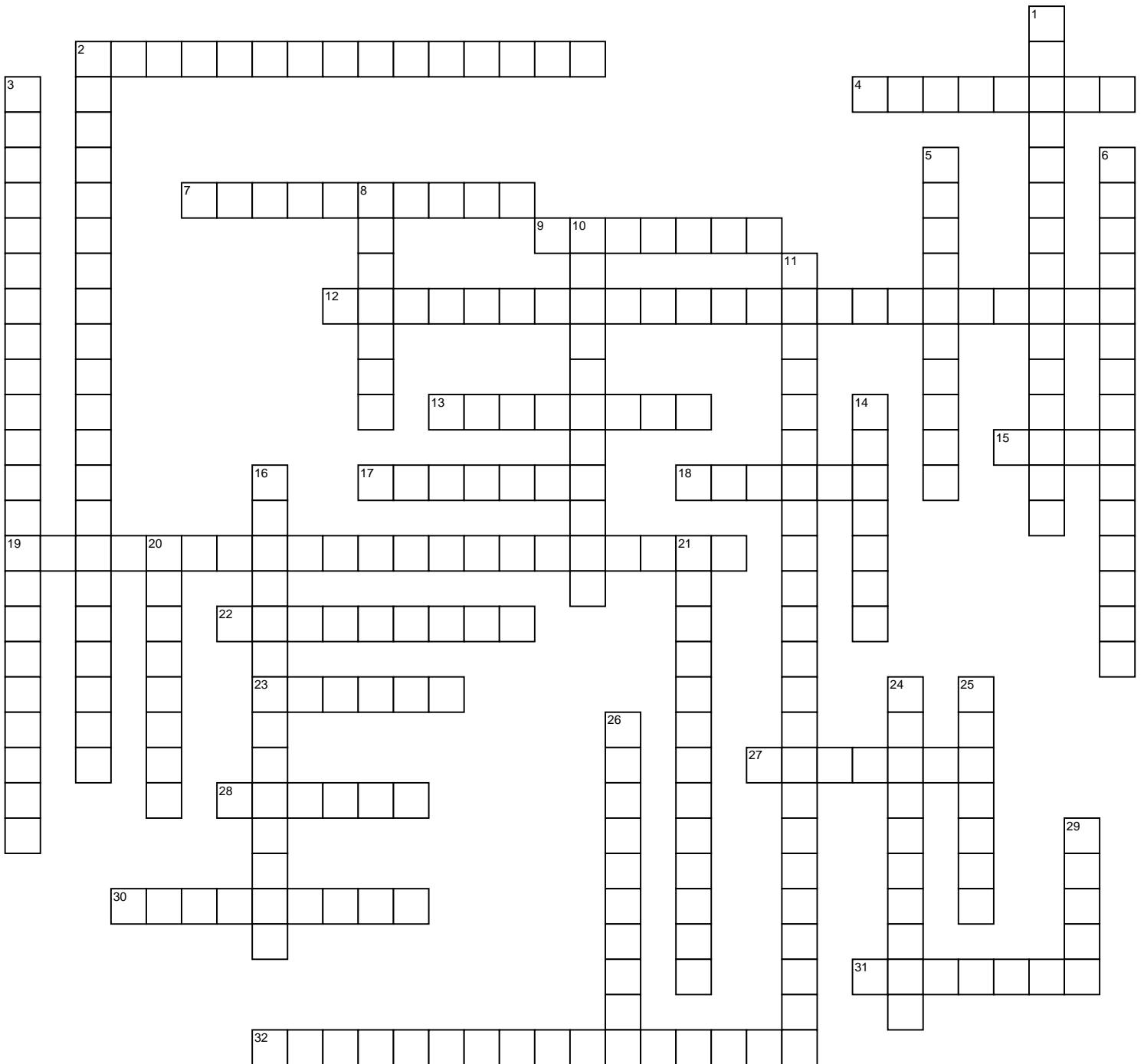


Criminal Law Crossword



ACROSS

- 2 offences which do not require mens rea for at least one element of the actus reus
- 4 an accomplice cannot do this at the scene of the crime
- 7 the type of recklessness in G and R
- 9 leading case on gross negligence manslaughter
- 12 a form of involuntary manslaughter
- 13 case about sexual offences and deception as to the nature or purpose of the act
- 15 maximum penalty for s.18 OAPA
- 17 the mental element in a crime
- 18 case where agreeing to shoot and be shot at led to murder conviction
- 19 not the same as necessity but close
- 22 the 'doing' part of the crime
- 23 case which denies an intoxication defence where D mistakenly believed he was acting in self-defence
- 27 case where it was necessary to take a sawn-off shotgun to bed
- 28 type of crimes requiring proof of causation
- 30 case on continuing act
- 31 acting out of this will prevent a defence of loss of control
- 32 D must foresee death or GBH to be this for a jury to infer intention

DOWN

- 1 an attempt must go beyond this
- 2 HOL in Savage and Parmenter held that D must foresee this to be guilty under s.20 OAPA
- 3 an accomplice will not be liable if the principal commits a crime which is this
- 5 the mens rea in Ghosh
- 6 a conspiracy which has been carried out
- 8 case on sexual jealousy and loss of control
- 10 the defence abolished by the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- 11 the defence which did not succeed in Kingston
- 14 one of the four types of statutory accomplice
- 16 one of the elements of the test for insanity
- 20 leading case on attempting the impossible
- 21 automatism comes from this
- 24 entry as this is part of burglary
- 25 the infamous red socks burglar
- 26 lack of this kind of belief in consent is the mens rea for rape
- 29 robbery is theft plus this
