Nick: My name is Nick Kamboj I'm from Chicago, Illinois, in United States of America.

Pierrette: My name is Pierrette. I am French but I was born in West Africa, Cameroon.

John: My name is John Kennedy Mogeni. I come from Kenya.

I would say to come to this programme so they can be able to have that close interaction with the lecturers and also to have a one-on-one session.

Pierrette: A good way to really connect and just set the tone for the rest of my studies, trying to really understand what is required and expected of us as students from the examiners but also just in terms of seeing how other people are thinking and preparing the workload.

Nick: I am a first year student. I'm not necessarily looking to change careers. I actually have multiple degrees and so forth, but I'm using my knowledge here to actually do what I currently do much more effectively. I'm an executive, I have a couple companies that I run and that I've founded, and I'm using the LLB at University of London to really provide that foundation for a lot of the international work that I do, a lot of the executive consulting work that I do and so forth.

These sessions have been absolutely outstanding. The return on investment has been so much greater than my investment. When you do the course readings, you can see all the lectures and so forth, but to actually be able to integrate that in a real life context with someone who is a practicing jurist or a practicing solicitor or a professor of law has been absolutely incredible in my understanding. I feel much more qualified, much more confident and have such a stronger base than I did just a few weeks ago. And for that reason, I found this to be absolutely valuable.

I was actually even thinking about coming back again in March to do the revision session. I can't speak enough about how wonderful this entire experience has been.

Pierrette: It has been fun to actually talk to people who are so passionate about what they teach and who are so passionate about their subjects, and who like to teach too, I think. Just being able to ask questions and really have that interaction with someone else was something that I needed, and it was definitely provided.
